Job role overview:

The Global Logistics Team is responsible for the management of all Triumph's logistics providers covering warehousing, air, sea, and road. The placement opportunity within our Logistics team will provide a global overview of Triumph and the opportunity to work on a number of complex and exciting projects.

All the work you will be involved in will be real everyday activities which will contribute to the overall success of the department and business. Working at the forefront of such an exciting and fast-moving industry is challenging. The successful candidate will require a high level of self-motivation and good organisational skills. Initiative and problem-solving skills will be key requirements in order to work successfully on both individual and team projects.

From day one you will become an active team member. The role will cover numerous areas of Supply Chain, including operations, inventory control, purchasing and provider management, giving a truly global overview of the business and allowing the candidates to work on a number of complex and exciting projects.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Project Management & Support:

1. Supporting the delivery of opportunities and translating ideas into a project plan to deliver operational or financial benefit.
2. Managing and driving projects to conclusion to agreed timescales and objectives.
3. Investigating process improvement and automation through tools such as Microsoft Excel, Microsoft Power Automate, Microsoft Power BI and Robotic Process Automation (RPA).
4. Supporting wider Global Logistics projects where required.
5. Supporting decisions based on rational operational and commercial reasoning.

Provider Management:

1. Creating a positive working relationship with third party logistics companies (3PLCs), ensuring open and clear lines of communication.
2. Supporting the achievement of performance and commercial KPIs. Using data and initiative to challenge where necessary.
3. Driving continuous improvement through data analysis, operational experience and best practice.
4. Defining, agreeing and documenting required processes and standards.
5. Leading meetings, ensuring that clear minutes highlighting actions; responsibilities; deadlines are recorded.
6. Supporting day to day activities with prompt resolution to highlighted issues ensuring full root cause analysis.
7. Working closely with and supporting the freight team in order to gain operational understanding.
8. Ensuring regular meetings with 3PLC's are carried out.
